Central Police University is our country's highest institution of police education, committed to nurturing security cadres who combine martial arts and moral integrity.

Based on the belief: "to build a country, the police system must be built first," President Chiang Kai-shek, founded the Central Police College in Nanjing in 1936. Despite several migrations and other hardships, what remains unchanged is its excellent school spirit, professionalism, and solid education. Dedicated to maintaining public order and protecting the people's rights and interests.

In 1995, it was renamed "Central Police University." Located in Guishan District, Taoyuan City. It has complete campus planning, with a quiet environment and green grass. A good place to improve one's virtue and refine one's achievements.

"Honesty" is the school motto, and our highest expectation for all students. It is hoped that every student can proceed from a place of sincerity, show it in practice, and achieve excellent school spirit through "diligent execution."

The school is affiliated with the Ministry of the Interior and is under the guidance of the Ministry of Education. It has a complete organizational system, in which the vice president, chief secretary, and all faculty are led by the president to handle various school affairs.

Teaching units include the College of Justice Administration, College of Police Science and Technology, and General Education Center. There are 13 departments, 14 master's programs and 4 doctoral programs under the two colleges.

The school system is divided into formative education, continuing education, and postgraduate education.

“Formative education” includes a four-year bachelor’s program and a two-year technical program. Students are publicly funded for their tuition and fees during the school period.

“Continuing education” includes police sergeant classes and various professional workshops, which provide advanced education and professional training for the promotion of police officers.

“Postgraduate education” includes graduate master’s programs, doctoral programs, and intermediate rank classes, with the goal of improving the level of police academic research and cultivating outstanding leaders.

We expand from the three core values of “country, justice, and honor,” and plan six major educational connotations.

Every summer vacation, we always welcome a group of freshmen who are ready to join the big family of Central Police University. Everyone comes here with different ideas and for different reasons, but all have one goal in common when they graduate. namely, to become a social security cadre.

Doing simple things over and over again will make things different. To make discipline a part of life, all students in our school receive accommodation and life education. Through education and training in areas such as autonomy and self-discipline, proper dress, regular work and rest, cooperation and mutual assistance, and politeness in advancing and retreating, a rigorous and upright police officer is cultivated.

In police professional education, we expect students to not only internalize the concept of human rights and enrich their subject knowledge, but apply what they have learned in practice as well. In the Criminal Forensics Building, there are many professional facilities, which provide students with complete training and operational experience, to enable them to apply what they have learned at school to their future police work.

Not only professional skills, but also a strong physique and physical training are indispensable. All students must undergo 900 hours of police skills training, to adapt to the challenging, strenuous, and dangerous work environment of the future.

To make this training possible, our course also includes simulation training of various scenarios, which teach emergency response capabilities and handling methods required in various situations. This helps students respond quickly and correctly to any situation in the future.

Spiritual education “fosters students’ ideological concepts of loyalty, patriotism, and value neutrality”, “cultivates a simple, honest, and self-sustaining attitude towards life”, and “trains their leadership ability to be firmly in command”.

“Sports Day” is held annually to inspire the determination to bring honor to the team. The highlight of the day is the “tug-of-war,” in which the spirit of “one rope, one heart” encapsulates the team’s centripetal force.

To demonstrate all the knowledge and skills students have learned in school, a 45-day internship education is carried out during summer breaks in the corresponding units, allowing students to understand the future workplace environment and the core competency that should be possessed, strengthening their attitude toward learning in school, and

giving them a clearer sense of direction and motivation.

In addition, to cultivate students' humanistic and artistic temperament, and civic and moral literacy, the General Education Center offers relevant general education and humanities courses. Furthermore, diverse exhibitions and large-scale art and cultural activities are held from time to time. In order that the philosophy of liberal arts education continues to be passed on.

The school also collects police cultural relics, historical materials, and police uniforms from various countries, and established the World Police Museum, to expand police academic research and international cooperation.

In addition to holding annual academic seminars to showcase the energy and achievements of police research, all departments invite well-known scholars at home and abroad to give speeches at the school. This enables students to better understand international trends and broaden their world outlook.

To promote international friendship and international exchanges, CPU has established sister schools with many foreign universities. Meanwhile, foreign students are accepted to the school for further study, and outstanding faculty and staff are selected to study abroad.

The school has an abundance of alumni, who inherit the demeanor of the alma mater in all fields, working hard, and giving back to society.

In recognition of Dr. Lee Chang-Yu's achievements in, and contribution to global criminal forensics, the school has set up a special multimedia exhibition area for Dr. Lee. We hope that students in the future can inherit this glory and carry on the spirit of their alma mater.
