

Implementation directions for Assessing the Physical Skills of Undergraduate and Graduate Students at Central Police University

1. To assess the physical skills of undergraduate and graduate students at Central Police University (hereafter referred to as the university), the following directions are stipulated according to Article 27, Regulation 4 of the university law.
2. In these directions, the term “students” refers to students who enroll in 4-year Bachelor’s degree program or 2-year technological program. The term “graduate students” refers to general full-time graduate students who were not previously cultivated in Central Police University and those full-time or part-time graduate students who are current police (hereafter called “on-the-job graduate students”).
3. During the study period, students in various departments are required to learn the following physical skills:
 - (1) Judo: Students and graduate students in the Department of Administration Police, Department of Criminal Investigation, Department of Public Security (Social Security Division), Department of Crime Prevention and Corrections (Prevention Division), Department of Traffic Science, Department of Foreign Affairs Police, Department of Information Management, Department of Border Police (Border Management Division), Department of Forensic Science, Department of Administrative Management, and

Department of Law

- (2) Shuai-jiao: Students and graduate students at Department of Public Security (Intelligence Service Division), Department of Crime Prevention and Corrections (Corrections Division), Department of Fire Science, Department of Border Police (Immigration Affairs Division), Department of Maritime Police, and Graduate School of Disaster Management
- (3) Shooting sport: Students and graduate students at Department of Administration Police, Department of Criminal Investigation, Department of Public Security, Department of Crime Prevention and Corrections, Department of Traffic Science, Department of Foreign Affairs Police, Department of Information Management, Department of Border Police, Department of Forensic Science, Department of Maritime Police, Department of Administrative Management, and Department of Law. Students and graduate students at Department of Fire Science and Graduate School of Disaster Management are required to learn “Fire-related physical skills” instead of shooting sport.
- (4) Comprehensive arresting skills: Students and graduate students at Department of Administration Police, Department of Criminal Investigation, Department of Public Security, Department of Crime Prevention and Corrections, Department of Traffic Science, Department of Foreign Affairs Police, Department of Information Management, Department of Border Police, Department of Forensic Science, Department of Maritime Police, Department of Administrative Management, and Department of Law

For each semester, the course content and assessment criteria for judo, shuai-jiao, shooting sport, and comprehensive arresting skills are stipulated by the Department of Student Affairs. Each semester’s course content and assessment criteria for fire-related physical skills are stipulated by the Department of Fire Science and Graduate School of Disaster Management.

Students who enter school with judo expertise and are recommended to enter the 4-year Bachelor’s degree program are not required to take the judo course but should participate in judo team training; their performance must be assessed by their team coach.

4. Undergraduate and graduate students must pass their physical skills assessment for each semester in order to graduate from the university. The pass criterion for each physical skill at each semester is 60 points. Those who fail a physical skill course at a semester must retake the physical skill course for that semester. Those who fail the course again must retake the course again.

Whether a student passes a physical skill course is determined by the instructor for that course. If each course has two instructors, a student’s performance should be assessed according to the average of the scores given by the two instructors.

5. The calculation of physical skills performance for a semester is as follows: The score on physical skills for a semester is calculated as follows: first, calculate the product of the score for each

physical skill course and the ratio of the number of hours for the physical skill course per week to the total of hours for all physical skills courses; then, sum up all products to obtain the score on physical skills for the semester.

6. Undergraduate and graduate students must pass their physical skills assessment for each semester in order to graduate from the university.
 - (1) Judo, shuai-jiao, and comprehensive arresting skills: The pass criterion for each physical skill at each semester is 60 points.
 - (2) Shooting sport: The pass criterion at each semester is 60 points. Those whose overall shooting performance levels do not reach the level of “marksman” cannot graduate from the university and should receive retraining.
7. Graduate students who are not qualified as a police officer (including those who have not passed the police special test) and are aged 40 or above or are currently at an eighth-grade position (or above) or at a lieutenant position (or above) may be exempted from taking judo, shuai-jiao, shooting sport, and comprehensive arresting skills courses after approval.
8. Foreign graduate students may be exempted from taking the physical skills courses stipulated by the directions after approval.
